Milanese Lace with Louise Colgan

This course will cover all levels of Milanese skills. A wide variety of patterns will be provided to suit both new and continuing Milanese students. Lace makers will be given the option of using colored threads to make their own unique pieces from the selected patterns. As with other similar free-style laces, individual interpretation of each design is part of the learning process.

REQUIRED SKILLS: Solid foundation in Bobbin Lace skills. Must know all basic stitches plus Footside or Pin- under-4 Edge. Diagram-reading skills are also recommended. Prior experience with Torchon and/or other Tape Laces will be beneficial, as well.
